Liquor worth Rs 6 lakh seized

CHANDRAPUR, Dec 25

SLEUTHS of Local Crime Branch (LCB) seized a Maruti Swift car and recovered 60 boxes of country liquor worth Rs 6 lakh during an intelligence based raids on Thursday night.

LCB had a tip off about the vehicle carrying liquor from Mangli in Pavni tehsil in Bhandara

district to Chandrapur via Nagbhid road. A trap was laid at Ram Mandir square in Nagbhid. The suspected vehicle came from Campa road and when cops tried to stop it, the vehicle driver started racing it at break-neck speed.

LCB team followed the vehicle and caught on Sindewahi road near Vividh Karyakari Society. Two people were travelling in the car. They have been identified as

Irfan Pathan (25) and Giridhar Khobragade (31), both from Nagbhid tehsil. During search of th car cops recovered 60 boxes of country liquor carrying a total of 6,000 bottles of liquor. The vehicle and liquor collectively worth Rs 11 lakh was seized from the accused duo. PSI Jitendra Vairagade, Vijay Sangidwar, Amjad Khan, Avinash Dashmwar, Mayur Yerne, took part in the raid.

Liquor, other material worth Rs 4 lakh seized

CHANDRAPUR, Dec 24

SLEUTHS of Local Crime Branch raided an illegal *mahua* country liquor production site under the jurisdiction of Chimur police station and busted the liquor den, and seized liquor and other material worth Rs 4 lakh during two consecutive raids on the same spot. PSI Sunil V Uike led the raid under the guidance of SP Sandeep Diwan and PI, LCB, Pagare.

According to officials sources, LCB had a tip off about the illegal production of *Mahua* liquor been set up in the jurisdiction of Chimur police station. Accordingly, a LCB team was dispatched to raid the premises. The LCB team raided the place on Chimur-Shegaon road, adjacent to Uma river close to Sonegaon diversion. The illegal brewery allegedly owned by Rukhmabai Sonawane was located adjacent to Balaji Dadmal farm on the river bank. Cops found people busy in extrating *mahua* liquor with crude instruments. Two people fled into the jungle on seeing the raiding party.

The team found drums filled with *mahua* liquor, and other material worth Rs 3.45 lakh on the place, which were immediately seized. The two accused in

the case are absconding and Chimur police have not taken up the manhunt for them.

ASI Daulat Chalkhure, Nitin Jadhav, Mahendra Bhujade, Ganesh Bhojar, Pranjal Jhilpe, Kundansingh Bawri took part in the raid.

Even as LCB team had raided the place on Wednesday, they again got information on Thursday that few people are again started brewing *mahua* liquor afresh in Uma river bed ahead in forest area close to previous spot.

Accordingly, the a team from Chimur police station dispatched a team and raided the place.

They seized a drum full of 400 litre of *mahua* liquor from the spot along with 1500 litres of the *mahua* and the equipments to brew the liquor worth Rs 1.85 lakh from the spot.

The accused Sharad Sonwane and Gurudas Sonwane who allegedly owned the material and were involved in brewing illegal liquor were booked under relevant section of law and have been declared absconding. PI Denish Labde along with PSI Sudhakar Makode, constable Kishor Bhode, Vasudev Teamam, Vijay Upre, Sushil Athwale, Avaita Kumre, Yogita Dahule took part in the raid.

3 housebreaking cases cracked, two arrested for stealing for fun

LOCAL crime branch has cracked three cases of house breaking and nabbed two miscreants who undertook burglaries for fun and frolic and purchase luxurious item for themselves. Investigations have revealed that the two carried to two burglaries in jurisdiction of Durgapur police station and one in Ramnagar Police Station area.

Accused Rohit alias Ilam Adeshrao Ilamkar (18), a resident of Sugat Nagar and Vishal Dadaji Khandale (21), a resident of Samta Nagar, Chandrapur, are friends and have history of involvement in house breaking cases.

The two are unemployed and have no source of income. LCB got a tip off about the duo

using costly mobile phones and maintaining luxurious standards of life with the help of stolen booty.

Accordingly, in-charge of LCB, J D Parage formed a team led by PSI Sunil Uike under guidance of SP Sandeep Diwan and sent them after the suspects.

Soon, the LCB team rounded-up suspects Ilamkar and Khandale from their respective localities.

During interrogation the duo confessed about carrying out two burglaries in Durgapur area and one another under Ramnagar Police Station jurisdiction during this year.

The two were formally arrested and taken to a place where they carried burglaries. Cops have recovered a Panasonic Television set, five sarees and home theatre comprising set of five speakers stolen during the burglary carried out in the jurisdiction of Ramnagar from the two.

2 vehicles smuggling illegal coal seized, 6 arrested

CHANDRAPUR, Dec 18

LOCAL crime branch seized two vehicles smuggling illegal coal in the area under Ballarpur Police Station following a tip-off.

The raid was conducted by the team of LCB in Shirram ward of Ballapur after they learnt that some people had hoarded coal illegally and were loading two vehicles to smuggle it somewhere. Accordingly, LCB team led by PSI Jitendra Valragade, conducted the raid at the place and found people loading coal into to mini trucks (TATA Ace). They failed to produce any document related to ownership of the coal and hence cops arrested five accused and seized both the vehicles. Cops informed that two vehicles worth Rs 4 lakh and coal worth Rs 22,000 was seized during the raid. Accused identified as Jagdish Pedapalliwari, Arun Savita, Ravi

Bahuriya, Ravindra Rajput, Pawan Waghade were arrested from the spot.

While returning from the successful raid, the team midway intersected another suspicious-looking vehicle. On inspecting the vehicle, they found stolen spare parts of heavy machinery from WCL area. When inquired as to where these parts were brought, the suspect travelling with the material in a carrier vehicle failed to give satisfactory answers.

Accused Sayyad Mujaffar alias Shahrukh Sayyad Hamza was arrested and stolen booty coal worth Rs 22,000 and vehicle worth Rs 3 lakh was seized from his possession.

Team led by LCB PSI Jitendra Valragade, ASI, Sunil Uike Rauf Sheikh, havildar, Gajanan, Nitin, Vijay Mahendra and others took part in the raid under the guidance of LCB incharge GD Pagare.

Durgapur Police crack theft cases, two held, booty recovered

CHANDRAPUR, Dec 15

UNIDENTIFIED thieves had struck at the house of Charles Kamble in Kerinandan Nagar on December 7 and had decamped with gold ornaments. Durgapur Police have successfully solved the case and arrested the juvenile. Cops also seized the stolen gold ornaments worth Rs 3.44 lakh from the accused.

According to police, Charles Kamble had gone out for work on the day of the theft. His wife and son had also gone out to attend a programme by locking the house. Taking advantage of this the accused broke the lock of the house and decamped with gold valuables worth Rs 3.44 lakh from the house. When Kamble returned home, they were shocked to find the front door open and gold ornaments stolen. Kamble immediately lodged a complaint with Durgapur Police. Offence under section 454, 457, 380 of IPC was registered by the police in the case.

Cops intensified investigation and checked as many as 57 suspects during first 7 days of the incident. They had recovered a footwear from the house which

led them to the accused. found at the residence of the Kamble gave the clue about the accused.

The minor was apprehended and he confessed of the crime and gave location of where he had kept the stolen booty.

In yet another success, cops cracked the case of motorbike theft and arrested the accused. The crime was registered at City Police Station in Chandrapur. Durgapur police recovered a Hero Honda motorbike (MH-34-AW/1645) during course of investigations from a house in Ward No 4 to Durgapur. It turned out that offence had been registered with City Police.

Cops arrested accused Prakash Barvekar (22) for stealing the mobike and seized the stolen vehicle. More cases of bike thefts is likely to be uncovered during investigation of the accused, cops claimed.

PSO, Durgapur, RK Singanjud led the investigations into the case with the help of PSI Dhiraj Bande, Havildar, Rajnikant Putthawar, Sunil Gaurkar, Chandu Nagre, Umesh Waghmare, Sandeep Kambl under the guidance of SP Sandeep Diwan, DySP Hemrajsingh Rajput and SDPO Pralhad Giri.
