

## Chandrapur cops rescue woman from Malawi

■ Doubting her character, the victim's husband left her alone without passport at Lilongwe and returned to India

CHANDRAPUR, June 25

WITH the initiative of Dr Mareshwar Reddy, District Superintendent of Police, Chandrapur Police Department rescued a woman from Lilongwe, capital of Malawi, a country in southeastern Africa, and helped her unite with her family.

The police department managed to bring back the married woman to Chandrapur after consulting with the High Commission of India in South Africa. Sayyad Aminoor, a resident of Padoli, got his sister married to Sheikh Shabad, a resident of Hyderabad,

some two years back. After marriage, Sheikh took the his wife to Lilongwe in Malawi where he was working.

Doubting her character, Sheikh returned to India and left his wife alone there without out passport. However, the woman, somehow managed to contact her brother Sayyad and informed him about her pathetic conditoin. Later, Sayyad lodged a complaint with Padoli police station. Considering the seriousness of the issue, Dr Reddy, DSP, consulted with the High Commission of South Africa through a mail and appealed to rescue the woman.

Following the request, of High Commission of India, a thorough investigation was done and the woman was sent to Chandrapur. The family members of victim have expressed gratitude towards Chandrapur police for rescuing her.
